



## **University of Guelph's Student Union takes a Stance Against G20 Police Tactics**

### **FOR IMMEDIATE RELEASE**

July 22, 2010—The Central Students' Association (CSA) at the University of Guelph has taken a stance against police brutality; more specifically, against the tactics used by the Toronto Police and all other police forces during the G20 summit, June 25, 2010 to June 28, 2010. The student union has also taken a stance against the deliberate miscommunication about the Public Works Protection Act.

CSA Communications & Corporate Affairs Commissioner Demetria Jackson describes the police actions at the G20 as “a repressive and oppressive scare tactic used to deter students from demonstrating against a government and system they do not feel represented by”.

Although it has been a month since the summit took place, this student union has not forgotten the vast human rights violations that took place that June weekend. The CSA stands in solidarity with other student unions across the country regarding this issue. Jackson says, “regardless of the amount of time passed since that weekend, all will never be forgotten”.
